


Resources you may need

If you suspect a vulnerable adult is the victim of abuse, neglect or exploitation, contact your local DHS County Office or call the Statewide Abuse Hotline at 1-800-522-3511. You can also make a report online at apspublic.okdhs. org. When you complete and submit the APS report, it will be forwarded to the appropriate county inbox. You will get a confirmation number when the report has been received. If you feel the vulnerable adult needs an emergency response for immediate health and safety risks, contact 911 immediately.
